



The Town of Wake Forest has historic buildings and districts designated through National Register of Historic Places or by Local Ordinance however there is no policy for recognizing significant sites that are either no longer standing or not included in another program

The desire for such a program was raised during the public outreach portion of the NE Community Plan Update

- Site of the Spring Street Presbyterian Church
- Site of the Wake Forest Normal and Industrial School





## Selection Process - HPC Applies the Criteria Based on Information Received

Qualifying Criteria Must be over 50 years of age Significant person, event, site Not currently recognized Location Identified Public view

Is a historic marker the proper form of recognition for the site? Majority of members must answer yes to proceed

#### Priority 1 (up to 5 points each) 20 point maximum/8 point minimum

- Lesser-known historical site, event, organization or person
- Site connected to under-represented history or historical narrative
- Building, public or private, of historical/cultural significance that was demolished
- Historical or cultural event at specific site

#### Priority 2 (up to 3 points each) 12 point maximum/3 point minimum

- Existing building of historical/cultural significance
- Historic Landscape
- Person or Organization of historical/cultural significance
- Site of historical or cultural significance

### <u>Priority 3</u> rity 3 (1 point each) 3 poi

maximum/1 point minimum

- Location is an under-represented area
- Impact on community (does the marker help create a sense of place within the community)
- Impact on preservation (Is this an area that needs recognition/area already recognized?)

**Self-Funded Marker Application** 

Due to limited funds the HPC Will only fund 5 markers per year

Up to 2 self-funded markers may be approved but must go through the same process

#### SELF-FUNDED HISTORIC MARKER PROGRAM

#### PROPOSED TITLE OF MARKER:

#### Policy

Private property owners, nonprofit organizations, and governmental departments/agencies may apply for self-funded markers for eligible sites. These marker applications will follow the same review and evaluation criteria as city- funded markers. No more than two self-funded markers may be approved annually.

The cost for a self-funded marker is approximately \$3,250.

The Historic Preservation Commission will approve text for self-funded markers. Staff will order the markers, and the fabricator will direct bill the applicant.

## Historic Marker Program - Marker Design Approved by the HPC June 9, 2021



#### **Single Post Mount**

Single post markers are manufactured with a mounting cap that include 8 set screws for securing the marker to the post. Standard marker orders ship with a 7' post with 3' to be inserted in ground with above grade positioning the marker panel for an appealing eye level of readability. A 10' post is available for mounting on side walk allowing for head room clearance and compliance with any loca sign ordinance.
